

MOUNTING SUGGESTIONS:

Indian Roadmaster 2015-up

Passenger Armrest

Hardware: Stock bolts

1/4"-20 x 1" chrome Phillips screw x 4

Chrome washer x 4 Pressure plug x 4

Tools needed: Phillips screwdriver

4mm Allen wrench 6mm Allen wrench

Removal of Stock Armrest:

1. Open the trunk and remove the trunk liner.



2. Locate the eight bolts mounting the armrest to the trunk. Remove these with a 6mm Allen wrench. This will disconnect the two support cables. 3. Locate the three bolts mounting the lumbar support pad to the trunk. Remove these with a 6mm Allen wrench.



4. If replacing the side panels as well, locate and remove the three bolts mounting the pads to the swivel base using a 4mm Allen wrench.

Installation of Mustang Armrest:

1. Position the lumbar support pad in front of the trunk, and, using a 6mm Allen wrench, secure to trunk using the three stock bolts.



2. Position the armrest in front of the trunk. Use the four supplied 1/4"-20 x 1" Phillips screws and washers to mount the armrest to the trunk. Reconnect the support cables with two of these screws.

3. Insert the four pressure plugs into the unused trunk holes. Re-install the trunk liner.



4. If mounting the side pads, position the pads on the swivel bases and, using a 4mm Allen wrench, secure with stock bolts.
